**The 51<sup>st</sup> (Highland) Division after St Valery Lecture  
by Brigadier Charles Grant**

An illustrated talk by Brigadier (Ret'd) C S Grant OBE will take place on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2010 with interested parties assembling in The Highlanders' Museum, Fort George at 1830 hrs.

Brigadier Charles Grant was commissioned into the Queen's Own Highlanders in 1968. He commanded the 51<sup>st</sup> Highland Brigade and was Director Land Warfare before retiring to take up the post of Chief Executive of the Highland Reserve Forces' and Cadets' Association. He retired from this appointment in 2007 and writes books on both military history and wargaming. He is President of ACFA (Scotland) and Honorary Colonel of 7 SCOTS. He is the historian for, and manages, the 51<sup>st</sup> Highland Division web site.

The talk will give an overview of the 51<sup>st</sup> Highland Division in World War Two. After a brief introduction on the original Division leading up to the capture of part of the Division at St. Valery (the subject of the Angus Hay lecture last year), the talk will concentrate on the reconstituted 51<sup>st</sup> Highland Division that went to North Africa. It will summarize the campaigns of the Division in North Africa, Sicily, Normandy, the Breakout, the Low Countries, Ardennes, Reichswald, Rhine Crossing and the final advance to victory in Germany. It is the story of tremendous endeavour and outstanding bravery by Highland soldiers in many of the key battles of World War Two.
