Sicily 2023

This year marks the 80th Anniversary of Op HUSKY, the Allied invasion of Sicily in 1943. The campaign involved the Seaforth and the Cameron Highlanders.

A remembrance service will be held in Sicily to commemorate the Operation and wreaths will be laid for the Seaforths and the Camerons who were killed in action. 130 Seaforth and Camerons lost their lives in Op HUSKY. Their average age was 23 years.

The Erracht Cairn

The Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders Regtl. Association commemorated the Bicentenary of the Raising of the 79th Regiment of Foot by erecting a permanent Memorial at Erracht. This was the birthplace and home of Lt Gen Sir Alan Cameron of Erracht KCB, who raised the Regiment in 1793 and remained its Colonel until his death in 1829.

The Erracht Cairn was built by members of the QOHLDRS and 2nd Bn. 51st Highland Volunteers under the command of Captain Ian MacDonald and unveiled on 3rd Sep 93. Thirty years on, the Cairn had suffered from the Lochaber weather and needed So the Association repair. engaged local stonemason, Mr Richard Alderson to undertake the necessary work.
