Welfare

The Association promotes the welfare of all Regimental concerned family veterans. A member or friend may identify a welfare need in someone who served in the Regiment. During Apr to Sep 23, the Association paid out £2,050 for 11 veterans with needs such as health and disability issues, brown and white and other needs. Exceptionally, if an Association branch chairman becomes aware of an urgent case, he may approve limited amount of welfare expenditure from branch funds (e.g. for food or heating). In such the Association cases reimburse the branch up to £100 per case on condition that the branch ensures the case has been reported to SSAFA for follow-up.
