Battle of Lion Box (April 1944)

On 7th April Matthew Hopkinson represented the Regiment at the National Memorial Arboretum (NMA) to commemorate the 3-day battle at the Lion Box, a British supply dump at Kanglatongbi, north of Imphal besieged by the Japanese. On the third day the Japanese broke through the perimeter and five Seaforths, ably commanded by Sgt David Campbell, prevented a largescale incursion. which threatened to cut the Box in half. Sqt Campbell was killed and Pte Silk wounded. Their brave defence helped the vast majority of stores to be evacuated to safety, depriving the Japanese of these much-needed supplies.
